In this case, it can be difficult to remove the sticky residue without ruining the fabric's finish. Fortunately, there are several methods for removing gum from washing machines that work perfectly and safely.

First, use a hot water cycle to soften the adhesive. You can also use a washcloth soaked in hot water. Afterward, to rinse the laundry thoroughly afterward to avoid the latex bits from mellow into the fabric. In addition, you should check the fabric carefully to ensure that no latex bits have melted into the material. Then, rinse the fabric thoroughly with cold water.

If you don't have a large washing machine, break it up into smaller sections. This way, you can ensure that the adhesive doesn't melt into the fabric and end up in your next load.
